### Why Did Jesus Die?

Why did Jesus die? In this part of the country, we have had one dominant answer to this question. God sent Jesus to die to pay for our sins. However, throughout the history of Christianity, this question has by no means been uniformly answered. In this course, we will look at the 3 dominant understandings of the cross and Jesus' death. We will examine both the appealing aspects and the theological problems each understanding raises. Finally, we will ask what the cross means for us as followers of Jesus 2000 years later.

For Such a Time As This: A Bible Study of the Book of Esther

### A Book Study of The Dance of the Dissident Daughter: A Woman's Journey from Christian Tradition to the Sacred Feminine by Sue Monk Kidd

After a jarring encounter with sexism in a suburban drugstore, author Sue Monk Kidd, finds herself on a difficult, but empowering journey to reclaim her life and her faith. Through exploring the 'sacred feminine' often pushed aside and hidden in our religious culture, she reshapes her life around a more wholistic understanding of God, church and relationships. Because of the popularity of this small group last fall, we are once again offering the opportunity for women of First Church to come together to explore where Monk's story resonates with your own and how including the sacred feminine in our faith experiences can bring healing to us all.

In April of this year we will be sending another First Church team to the US/Mexico border in McAllen, Texas. We have once again partnered with the Southeast Jurisdiction's United Methodist Volunteers in Mission to develop an educational experience that also incorporates service and first hand experience involving issues related to immigration. As we seek to live into our priorities of doing justice and asking tough questions, we hope to meet those most affected by issues of immigration and learn from their experiences. We hope to speak with and learn from border patrol agents and service providers as well as local church leaders and prosecutors working on cases involving illegal entry. ## Organ Rededication Concert IN HONOR OF MARY ANN BATES

### - Featuring Dr. Fred Teardo -

### SUNDAY, MARCH 8, AT 3:00PM IN THE SANCTUARY RECEPTION IN THE LARGE DINING ROOM TO FOLLOW

Thanks to many generous donors in 2019, we were able to have our 2000 Casavant organ restored to its pristine playing condition. The bulk of the work, which was completed by Morris Organ Curators of Atlanta from June through November, did not greatly affect the way the organ sounds but was essential for it to continue to play for years to come. The most audible work included the return of the Echo Division (the room of pipes in the back of the church) and the zimbelstern.

In celebration of this restoration, we are hosting a rededication concert given in honor of Mary Ann Bates, who has served in many positions in the North Alabama Conference, the Southeast Jurisdiction, and at Lake Junaluska. Mary Ann has two degrees in music and has served as a high school, civic, and church choral director, singer, teacher, organist, and pianist in Hartselle, Decatur, and Tuscaloosa, as well as supporting her husband, Ralph, in his life of ministry and service.

Dr. Fred Teardo, Director of Music and Organist at the Cathedral Church of the Advent in Birmingham and Instructor of Organ at Samford University, is our guest organist for the concert. Dr. Teardo received the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the Yale School of Music, where he was Chapel Organist, and his Bachelor of Music degree with Highest Honors from the Eastman School of Music. Dr. Teardo has performed extensively across the United States and has appeared on Pipedreams. Please join us as we celebrate the gift of beautiful music and the restoration of our Casavant organ.

## BRITTEN'S ABRAHAM & ISAAC

On Sunday, March 8 in the Sanctuary service, Patrick Evans and Cathy Shelton, with guest artist Augustine Mercante, will present a staged production of Benjamin Britten's two-person canticle Abraham and Isaac. The text comes from one of the medieval Chester Mystery Plays. In medieval England, workers' guilds would publicly perform plays based on biblical stories in order to teach the masses the important stories of faith - the Creation, Noah's Flood, the Last Judgement, and others. Benjamin Britten, the greatest English composer of opera of the 20th Century, composed this Abraham and Isaac canticle in 1952 for the English opera group. In this service, we will examine the role of sacrifice and obedience in light of a terrifying biblical story.
