A second team of individuals, led by PJ Hester, is hand-writing notes of love to all who will receive a package via mail or home delivery. Deana Solfronk is baking 1300 cookies to be delivered with packages going to homes. You should receive your stewardship materials by September 14 either hand delivered by a church member or via mail. While we wish we could deliver every package in person for the chance to offer the loving contact we all need, we acknowledge that due to our very wide geographical reach, as well as COVID-19 precautions, we will have to mail some stewardship material. Whether delivered in person or mailed we hope you receive the package with love as it was prepared with you in mind!

During our stewardship focus this September we will explore how all that we do, say, and believe should be grounded first and foremost in love. We may give, serve, and speak wanting to 'do good' but without love it is impossible to bring life within us or around us to its fullest. In these uncertain times it is paramount that we remember we are called to act from a place of love and to allow that love to empower us to rise above the false security promised by material wealth, tribalism, and our fears. Love is what has the power to unburden us enough to let go of systems of power, engage us in generous living, and give us courage to share the truth that ALL are worthy of acceptance and belonging. AS WE WRAP UP OUR STEWARDSHIP FOCUS "WITH LOVE," WE WANT TO CELE-BRATE OUR CONGREGATION'S GENEROSITY BY SPENDING A LITTLE FACETIME TO-GETHER. YOU ARE INVITED TO BRING A BLANKET/CHAIR, ALONG WITH SOMETHING FOR YOU TO EAT AND DRINK, AND JOIN THE FIRST CHURCH FAMILY IN THE PARK FOR A MUCH LONGED FOR CHANCE TO BE TOGETHER OUTSIDE. WE WILL MINIMIZE RISK BY FOLLOWING GUIDELINES OF REGISTERING FOR THE EVENT (TO BE ABLE TO PROVIDE CONTACT TRACING), MAINTAINING SOCIAL DISTANCE OF AT LEAST 6 FEET, HAVING SANITIZER PRESENT, WEARING MASKS, AND TAKING TEMPERATURES OF ANYONE GATHERING. Shameless: Deconstructing Purity Culture by Nadia Bolz-Weber

A book study for women facilitated by Melissa Scott-Dixon Mondays for 4 weeks beginning October 5, 6:00-7:30

Hosted by the Women's Book Study Group, we will use Shameless as a jumping off point. We will discuss the messages we have received about sexuality from church, family, and society as well as how to develop a healthy, body-positive, life-giving sexual ethic at any point in life. The Bible Tells me So... Why Defending Scripture Has Made Us Unable to Read It by Peter Enns

A book study for men led by Rev. Herb Robertson and Dr. John Draper Tuesdays for 6 weeks beginning September 29, 7:00pm

This is a six-week book study for men who want to have honest and open discussion about the Bible. What if God is actually fine with the Bible just as it is? Not the well-behaved version we struggle to create, but the messy, troubling, strange and ancient Bible that we actually have? Maybe this Bible has something to show us about our own sacred journey of faith. What if the Bible's raw messiness isn't a problem to be solved—it's an invitation to a deeper faith? This class will involve purchase of Enn's intriguing book, reading one chapter each week (30-40 pages), possibly listening to a podcast, and participating in weekly Zoom meetings for discussion.

Howard Thurman: Pastor to the Civil Rights Movement

Led by Rev. Matt Lacey
Tuesdays for 4 weeks beginning October 6, 6:30pm – 8:00pm

Besides a Bible, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. is rumored to have carried one other book in his brief-case at all times: a worn copy of Jesus and the Disinherited by Howard Thurman. This small group will examine why Thurman was an inspiration to the Civil Rights movement leaders, and why he is still inspirational and relevant to the world, and to us at First Church, today. Over the weeks we will watch the PBS documentary "Backs Against the Wall: The Howard Thurman Story" (an hour long film available free online), read some of his most essential writings, including from Jesus and the Disinherited and his autobiography.

Participants will be asked to purchase Howard Thurman: Essential Writings by Luther Smith, Jr., and encouraged (but not required) to read his autobiography *With Head and Heart and Jesus and the Disinherited*. How to be an Antiracist by Ibram X. Kendi

In 2019 Ibram X. Kendi released *How to be an Antiracist*, a book which asks us to consider what an antiracist society might look like and how we can play an active role in building it. In our reading and discussion together we hope to move beyond an awareness of racism and move toward a consideration of how to form a more just and equitable society. When we lose someone or something we love, or even something we look forward to or hope for, it is normal to experience grief. 2020 has brought much for us to grieve as individuals, families, and as a global community. Many have experienced the death of a loved one without the traditional rituals of celebrating their lives, which means our grief is often absent of in person contact from our support network in cluding hugs and opportunities to cry on and be held up by the shoulders of those we love. Some of us are isolated from friends and family as we seek to stay healthy which leaves us grieving the loss of companionship. All of us have experienced fu ture plans being canceled or put on hold leaving us grieving what should have been. Our grief may be specific or ambiguous, but all grief must be acknowledged and honored in order to breathe through it with grace to allow healing to occur.

In this group we will meet to listen to one another and honor one another's grief in whatever form it takes. We welcome anyone 19 and older who is grieving any of the above mentioned losses and wants to courageously come together for community, connection, closeness, and compassion. We plan to meet in person (if we are able) following First Church guidelines which include temperature checks, masks, social distancing, etc. (When we are not able to gather in person, we will gather via Zoom.) Glen Iris Grace began its fourth year of weekend backpack food service this August. By the time you read this we will have packed and delivered 4,025 bags of non-perishable food during its third year. Of course this would not be possible without your generosity and our wonderful volunteers.

Our current plans will be to serve Midfield Elementary until the Birmingham City System opens for in-person learning at Glen Iris Elementary. Midfield is having virtual only learning for the first nine weeks, but they continue to feed their students with our donations. We delivered over 1,000 bags to Midfield during April, May, and June of this year alone. The school counselor says that when she drove the bus into the neighborhoods all the children, including toddlers, came running as though she was the ice cream truck!

Thank you for making this program of feeding hungry children a success. When one considers that in Alabama 1 in 4 children live in poverty and go to bed hungry, it really calls to mind the book of Luke 12:48, "For unto whomever much is given, of him much shall be required."


