


CONNECTIONS

In order to attend you MUST sign up via <u>SIGNUP GENIUS</u>. Signing up is necessary to limit space and to collect necessary information for contact tracing in the event that we learn there has been possible COVID-19 exposure. We will not allow entry to anyone walking up without prior registration.

ADVENT & CHRISTMAS WORSHIP CALENDAR

As we continue to navigate our way through a global pandemic we are preparing to offer additional ways for us to build connection and worship together. All of our virtual worship experiences will continue throughout the remainder of this year so that anyone needing as minimal risk as possible can have meaningful ways to worship. However, knowing how important space is to many people during the holy season of Advent, we plan to additionally offer in-person worship opportunities. These worship opportunities will vary in style. The Loft and Sanctuary worship spaces will have a maximum capacity of worship attenders and sign-ups will be required to attend. The services will be about 30 minutes in length. Masks will be required at all times and there will be no indoor congregational singing or congregational liturgy to minimize the spread of airborne droplets. Additional churchwide communication will be provided prior to the beginning of Advent. We are looking forward to worshipping both virtually and in-person during the Advent season. Project 12/25 holds a special place within our church's heart. This year we are expanding to incorporate different opportunities for giving and relationship building. We are one community that lives and serves within a much wider community. As we expand the avenues in which God has called us to generously give and intentionally build relationships, our hope is that each individual will find an area that challenges them to build a deeper connection to expand beyond the very needed purchases of gifts and food.

This expansion includes support for systemic change, for our community partners, and support for our First Church family.

SYSTEMIC CHANGE | URBAN MINISTRY - WE BUILD

We are thrilled to support a new, exciting, and life-giving program at Urban Ministry called WE Build. Urban Ministry believes the most significant resources in West End are her people and they want to invest in their people with homeownership. Through working with the Birmingham Land Bank, Urban Ministry will buy neglected houses in West End and work with local residents who want to own a home. By expanding their current house-painting ministry into a home remodeling service, they will teach young adults carpentry and repair skills. Once the homes are repaired, Urban will offer the young adults an interest-free path to homeownership. Not only will this ministry allow low-income residents to own homes and build wealth, but it will also renovate neglected houses in West End while patronizing black-owned local businesses. West End residents will pay a monthly rent based on a percentage of their income. When their rent covers the cost of the house, Urban Ministry will deed the house into their name. It's that simple. The rent money collected from each tenant will be saved in a designated account that will be used to buy and renovate more homes. It is a ministry that multiplies.

STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

As we continue to follow up on our With Love stewardship campaign we have collected 204 pledges for a total of \$1,073,544.20. This goes a long way in helping fulfill our 2021 operating budget. As a reminder, our 2020 operating budget was 1.3 million dollars. While we have not yet reached our goal we are well on our way. If you have not submitted your 2021 pledge we invite you to do so by clicking **HERE**. Your individual gifts help us achieve our collective goals for ministry.v

Even though we have been in a global pandemic that has brought much uncertainty and struggle First Church has continued to do well budgetarily in 2020. Through the month of September:

- Our net income year to date was \$89,118 better than budget
- Congregational giving was up \$35,986 or 4.1% better than budget year to date
- We received \$22,072 from the Chalker Trust, as directed by trust agreement
- Total expenses were \$96,328 under budget
- Conference payments: clergy benefits paid through September; apportionment payments made through August
- \$20,000 designated apportionment payment made to North Annual Conference
- Plant Operation & Maintenance was \$50,621 under budget

Thanks to your faithfulness and generosity 2020
has been hard but not insurmountable. We
are maintaining our budget commitments
and growing in our giving thanks to each of
you. It is our prayer that as we move into the
final months of the year we will be able to finish the
year strong. Thank you for your generosity!



During the last year, we have come to understand and value the love and support that our congregational care team offers our church through their support and prayers. They are a vital and life-giving ministry here at First Church. We have also learned how important information is during a season of being away from one another due to the pandemic. Each week the congregational care team receives an email with prayer requests from our church family. Along with that weekly email the team receives any death notices as well as any urgent or pressing concerns from our congregation.
