CONNECTIONS





In Lent, we're reminded that, again and again, suffering and brokenness find us. We doubt again, we lament again, we mess up again. Again and again, the story of Jesus on the cross repeats—every time lives are taken unjustly, every time the powerful choose corruption and violence, every time individuals forget how to love. With exacerbation we exclaim, "Again?! How long, O God?" And yet, in the midst of the chaos of our lives, God offers a sacred refrain: "I choose you, I love you, I will lead you to repair." Again and again, God breaks the cycle and offers us a new way forward.

In this season we will embrace ritual to help us remember and be transformed. Again and again we will come to God with our prayers, our dreams, our hopes, and our doubts. This embodied practice will help us build muscle memory. The repetition will help to retrain our neural pathways. We need these 46 days of Lent because this season shapes us into more faithful disciples. Join us this Lent as again and again, we bring all of who we are to God and trust that God will meet us, time and again, along the way.

This year for Ash Wednesday First Church will offer two opportunities for a meaningful beginning to the Lenten season. There will be a virtual service livestreamed on Facebook at 6:30pm on Wednesday, February 17. Prior to the service, on Tuesday, February 16, Stephanie will teach the congregation how to make ashes from home so that you all will be able to fully participate in the virtual service.

We will also offer two in-person opportunities for you to come to the church to receive drive-thru ashes. From 12:00pm - 1:00pm and then again from 5:00pm - 6:00pm, ashes will be implemented in the alley off of 18th Street North and our parking lot. Folks will receive ashes at the end of the alley where there are three parking spaces. You will be encouraged to park, receive ashes, and receive the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust, you shall return." A Book Study for Women Einstein and the Rabbi by Naomi Levy

Sundays for 4 weeks beginning February 28, 4:30pm - 6:00pm via Zoom FACILITATED BY JENNIFER WATERS

Hosted by the Women's Book Study Group, we will use Einstein and the Rabbi: Searching for the Soul by Naomi Levy as a jumping off point for discussion. The book centers on the exploration of the meaning and purpose of the soul as inspired by the famous correspondence between Albert Einstein and a grieving rabbi. Participants will want to purchase or borrow a copy of the book.

Queer Theology
Tuesdays for 5 weeks beginning February 23, 6:00pm - 7:00pm via Zoom LED BY REV. HENRY GIBSON

You are invited to participate in a 5-week study of Queer Theology based on the book Radical Love by Patrick S. Cheng (the book is recommended but not required to join in the discussion). In this study, we will explore the depth of lessons to be learned from the contextual theology of the LGBTQIAP+ Christian perspective. The importance of love plays a significant role in Christian theology generally. However, LGBTQIAP+ Christians offer a unique perspective on love that may help us more fully understand the nature of God more broadly. This small group will be led by Rev. Henry Gibson who serves on staff at our sister church Highlands UMC and will be open to both First Church and Highlands members and friends.

Converge Young Adult Small Group

Weather permitting, this group will hike trails at Red Mountain Park, Ruffner Mountain, and at least one loop at Oak Mountain in order to experience a diversity of trails in our area. CELEBRATING "LITTLE EASTERS"

Lent is the 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter. If you count the days on your calendar, you will find more than 40 because Lent excludes Sundays. Christians consider every Sunday a celebration of the Resurrection. As a part of our journey this year, we are encouraging you to practice "little Easters" on one day of each weekend during Lent. On these days we pause our fasting and celebrate Christ's gift of love for us. Using practices from around the world, we have collected a list to inspire you to a bit of fun and celebration. All of our ideas are shared below so that you can plan ahead. In addition, we will post these practices to Facebook and Instagram each Saturday during the Lenten season. We hope you will share pictures and stories of the ways that you find "little Easters" in your midst.

FEBRUARY 20-21 | CULTIVATE NEW LIFE

Plant seeds, bulbs, or flowers and watch them grow over the next several weeks.

FEBRUARY 27-28 | BAKE SOMETHING TO SHARE

Make cookies or bread and bake enough to share with friends or neighbors

MARCH 6-7 | HAVE AN OMELET FEAST

Celebrate like they do in the French village of Bessiéres with an omelet feast of your own

MARCH 13-14 | FLY A KITE

Make your own kite or buy one in a store but get outside and release your inner child.

MARCH 20-21 | DYE EASTER EGGS

Buy a kit and dye your own Easter eggs or get creative and make homemade egg dyes.

MARCH 27-28 | HAVE A PICNIC

Pack up your blanket and favorite foods and take them outside to enjoy.

UPDATE

Thanks to everyone who has enabled Glen Iris Grace to keep going during COVID. We deliver a total of 150 bags each week to Glen Iris and Midfield Elementary Schools. Each bag contains 12 - 15 items of nonperishable food and costs about \$6. At Glen Iris the students who pick up lunches also pick up their weekend food bags every Friday. Midfield is able to run buses to deliver lunches four days per week and our weekly food bags every Thursday.

Because of the generosity of so many, we purchased 100 Midfield Piggly Wiggly gift cards worth \$40 each. The counselor distributed these the week before Christmas. Glen Iris had so much illness in December, we decided to do something special for them in the spring. (Normally we help them with their Fall Festival, but it was cancelled this year.)

After COVID, we will be back to packing bags at church and will welcome your help. We appreciate your support and prayers for the many hungry children in the Birmingham metro area. We hope to expand this ministry once the pandemic restrictions ease.
