## Lithematices

Lent is the 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter. If you count the days on your calendar, you will find more than 40 because Lent excludes Sundays. Christians consider every Sunday a celebration of the Resurrection. As a part of our journey this year, we are encouraging you to practice "little Easters" on one day of each weekend during Lent. On these days we pause our fasting and celebrate Christ's gift of love for us. Using practices from around the world, we have collected a list to inspire you to a bit of fun and celebration. All of our ideas are shared below so that you can plan ahead. In addition, we will post these practices to Facebook and Instagram each Saturday during the Lenten season. We hope you will share pictures and stories of the ways that you find "little Easters" in your midst.

## MARCH6-7 I HAVEANOMELET FEAST

Celebrate like they do in the French village of Bessiéres with an omelet feast of your own.

## MARCH 13-14 I FlYAKHE

Make your own kite or buy one in a store but get outside and release your inner child.

## MARCH 20-21 | DYEEASTEREGGS

Buy a kit and dye your own Easter eggs or get creative and make homemade egg dyes.

## MARCH27-28 I HAVEAPICNIC

Pack up your blanket and favorite foods and take them outside to enjoy.

## STATIONS OF THE CROSS

During the 3 week span from MONDAY, MARCH 15 THROUGH FRIDAY, APRIL 2 you will have the opportunity to come to First Church and move through the Stations of the Cross. These stations have been created by the staff and lay persons at First Church to help us move alongside our Lenten theme of "Again \& Again: A Lenten Refrain." Each station will invite you to reflect on both the historical and modern contexts while also considering traditional Stations of the Cross scripture. While we know that Easter is coming, this experience is intentionally created to help us sit with the loss and grief that comes before celebration. The stations will be placed under the covered walkway throughout our courtyard and can be experienced at your convenience during those three weeks. We encourage you to make the most of this experience by turning your phones to silent and being fully present. We hope this practice will enhance your experience this Lenten season.

## MAUNDY THURSDAY M-ESM R

You are invited to gather around your table at home as we break bread while remembering Maundy Thursday. As we did last year, we will offer a live streamed virtual service around the table at 6:00pm on Thursday, April 1. You are invited (if you are comfortable) to include those you feel safe to share a meal with (outside is preferable) and allow this time to be reminiscent of the early church gatherings in homes celebrating the Lord's Supper. Our live stream will instruct you as you journey throughout the meal. We encourage you to make plans to adorn your table with meaningful place settings as well as foods that help you honor those you love and long to be with more fully. We will provide you with recipes for making your own communion bread prior to the service or you can simply grab some at the grocery store. We hope you will join us around the table as we remember together.

## GOODFRIDAY <br> Friday, April 2 at 12:00pm

You are invited to join us for a virtual Tenebrae service on Good Friday, April 2 at 12:00pm as we commemorate the crucifixion and death of Jesus. The word Tenebrae is Latin for "darkness" or "shadows," and describes a service that offers prolonged meditation on the suffering of Christ. Through dramatic readings and the play between light and dark we will remember what it must have felt like in those moments when Christ's death darkened the world. We invite you to tune in via livestream as we remember the grief and loss of Good Friday.
