WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY



CHURCH-WIDE RECREAT

FEBRUARY 11-13TH, 2022 AT LAKE GUNTERSVILLE STATE PARK

You don't want to miss First Church's retreat! Our annual retreat is one of the most significant times to build community and make connections...not to mention grow spiritually. This year's theme is Manna and Mercy. Throughout the weekend we will journey through the whole Bible – from Genesis to Revelation – using Daniel Erlander's book *Manna and Mercy* as our guide. This will offer us a way to read the Bible as life-giving as we:

- · Learn how context shapes the meaning of Scripture
- · Read the Bible through the lens of Jesus' life, teaching, death, and resurrection
- · Learn that we value inclusivity and social justice not in spite of the Bible but because of it
- · Be challenged to live in a way that brings life to ourselves, our families, and to the whole world
- · Live into our identities as God's children created in love, by love, and for love

Over the years Manna and Mercy has become the theological foundation of our mission statement and six priorities at First Church. We encourage everyone to experience a Manna and Mercy retreat at least once...preferably more than once!

In addition to meaningful content, the retreat will also offer plenty of free time to get to know our church family better while enjoying all that the park has to offer. Recreational options include golfing, fishing, kayaking, canoeing, hiking, playgrounds, basketball courts, and plenty of space to relax while enjoying beautiful scenery.

This retreat is for the entire family. Childcare and children's recreational options will be available for kids from preschool through elementary. Youth, though included in the learning sessions, will have opportunities to gather together as well during the weekend.

The cost for the weekend is \$175 for a single registration, \$300 for a couple registration, and \$350 for a family of four (\$25 for each additional family member beyond that). 
