

CONNECTIONS





During this Advent season we will use A Sanctified Art's theme of "How Does a Weary World Rejoice?" as we follow the Gospel of Luke who begins the story of Jesus by interweaving the parallel stories of Elizabeth, Zechariah, and John the Baptist. In considering these birth narratives alongside one another we see the full scope of human emotions: isolation, fear, disbelief, connection, trust, and joy. The Christmas season is often an emotionally-charged time when we feel many things deeply - sometimes all at once.

This series is designed to remind us that it all counts - we need to acknowledge the weariness of the world while also seeking real and daily moments of joy. Each week we will respond to the question "How does a weary world rejoice?" with a statement inspired by our scriptures which demonstrate rhythms for rejoicing, even in the midst of difficult circumstances.

AN INVITATION FROM AN INVITATION FROM SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS

For over two decades psychologist and trainer, Dr. Deborah Threadgill Egerton, MA, Ph.D., has been teaching the Enneagram as a valuable mechanism for social justice and anti-racism and using it as a blueprint to reconnect people across all dimensions of diversity. Her new book, Know Justice Know Peace, is bringing those efforts down to grass-roots movements in local communities all over the world. This guide will help us understand why each of us must examine how we came to ingest life experiences that led us to negatively see members of the human family as "different from me." Journeying through the Enneagram, we see how "othering" has created near permanent mindsets and recognize how the darkness hides within our type structures. The good news is that if we are willing to take this journey together, there is deep personal healing and increased wholeness that will help God mend the entire universe.
